Dear Parent/Carers

I hope you are well. I apologise for writing to you in the school holidays but I just want to ensure you have all the correct information to hand. All the information is on our website and in our electronic handbook www.boteler.org.uk/handbook but sometimes it is nice to have the key information to hand.

I did correspond to you all via the Head's Herald (for new Year 7 Parents/Carers this is my weekly bulletin) regarding the standards and expectations. However, a timely reminder often helps, as the end of term is so busy.

SCHOOL DAY AND ENTRY TO SCHOOL — CHANGES

YEAR 10 & YEAR 11 STUDENTS

Year 10 and Year 11 students must enter the school via the front door in a morning. Students are to line up behind their Year Group number, which is painted on the floor, and wait for the Head of Year to come and greet them and bring them a free breakfast. They will have a standards check before they enter the building.

YEAR 7. 8 & 9 STUDENTS

Year 7, 8 and 9 students will **enter school through the gates next to the Ball Hall.** They will then line up in designated Year Group areas. Each Year Group area will be given a number so they know where to line up. Students are to line up behind their specific number where they will be met by their Form Tutor who will greet them and bring them a free breakfast. They will have a standards check before they enter the building.

If it is inclement weather all students will be directed to a designated internal area to wait. Those students attending breakfast clubs will be allowed access sooner than 8.25am.

Please note, at 8.30am the gates on the Ball Hall side of the school will close. Any students arriving after this time will need to sign in as 'late' at the main reception.

Students will have their uniform and equipment checked on arrival to school. Any issues will be dealt with before they get to Form. Please make sure that your child arrives to school every day with a fully stocked



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pencil case, scientific calculator, reading book and Independent Study Pack – ISP (which will have their Knowledge Organisers in). Students can buy equipment if needed as they enter school.

PARENT PARKING

If you bring your child to school or pick them up by car, please do not use the main drive to the school, unless your child has a disability or specific need. There is limited parking available on the Ball Hall car park (although entry will be restricted between 2.40pm and 3.00pm for safety reasons). If you park on Knutsford Road, please take care not to cause an obstruction.

The new academic year will begin on Monday 5th of September 2022 and this will be Week 1.

UNIFORM SUMMARY (FOR ALL LEARNERS)

COMPULSORY UNIFORM

- Oakleigh tartan kilt style skirt (knee length) or black, formal style trousers, (no skinny styles, jeantype material, leggings, lycra or similar).
- Blue school shirt with collar and top button (no logos and no open neck blouses).
- Clip-on school eco-tie in navy blue with school crest available from the Main Office priced £5.50.
- Navy blue blazer with school crest on. The Warrington Schoolwear Centre already has these on the blazers. If you find a cheaper blazer then you can put the crest on yourself. The school crests can be purchased from the Main Office priced £2.50). If a student forgets his/her blazer, we have a stock from which they can select a blazer to wear for the day.
- Plain black knee socks or plain black 60 denier (plus) tights are to be worn with skirts. Ankle socks with skirts are not permitted. Over the knee socks are not permitted. Plain black ankle socks only to be worn with trousers. We will issue spare skirts/tights/socks should a young person fail to comply with the standards. If a skirt is too short, then the person wearing it will be given tights until a new skirt can be purchased.

As a parent/carer you need to register with Price & Buckland before you can make a purchase.

SIZING

Waist sizes are 20, 22", 24", 26", 28", 30", 32", 34", 36", 38" & 40"; the waist is adjustable. There are 2 skirt lengths. All waist sizes are available in a long length (21"). **The length chosen must meet school criteria i.e. the length must be below the knee.**

If a student is tall and the length of the skirt does not meet school criteria, a special order can be made for an extra-long length skirt.

DELIVERY

Skirts from Price and Buckland can be ordered online and shipped to a home/work address for a small additional fee. You can also choose to order online and ship to school; this service is provided free of charge; it can take up to 2 weeks for your order to arrive at school. All delivery information is available on the Price & Buckland website; just click on the delivery tab.

SHOES

Black, flat, polished shoes with no other colours or marking must be worn at all times. Shoes with a sports logo **are not** permitted. No trainers, boots, canvas pumps, heels or shoes that are unable to be polished are permitted. Do not assume stores that label their stock "School Shoes" will be an appropriate purchase. If a student is not wearing the correct shoes, we have suitable footwear that will be made available for them to wear for the day. This is not negotiable.

COMPULSORY PE KIT

Bottoms:

Surridge branded blue shorts, skort or leggings. Any other shorts or leggings WILL NOT be permitted they have to be Surridge branded ones.

Classic navy sock (only required to be worn with the shorts and skort)

In the colder weather students can also wear Surridge tracksuit bottoms (Tek pants). All other tracksuit bottoms **WILL NOT** be permitted. These are also useful as a warm-up layer for students who represent the school teams.

Tops:

Surridge Blade T-Shirt

Students can also purchase the Surridge 'Performance Top' which acts as an additional useful layer for representing the school or in the winter months.

If female students wish to be part of a school team a skort must be purchased.

Orders purchased can be posted to school free of charge and will be given to students upon delivery or items can be posted to a home address for a small additional extra charge.

Students are not allowed to wear hoodies or additional branded clothing other than the school PE kit.

PERSONAL APPEARANCE

SHIRT AND TROUSER STYLES

Shirts must have a collar (casual shirts and open neck shirts are not permitted) and be worn appropriately, i.e. shirts must be tucked in, collars buttoned at the top. Trousers should be tailored. Trousers should be worn with a plain black belt where necessary and should not hang below the waist. Very skinny trousers, jeans or leggings are not permitted. Our skirts are specially designed for the school and are to be worn on or below the knee. Alterations to the length of a skirt are not permitted.

HOODIES AND NON-UNIFORM JUMPERS OR TOPS

Under NO circumstances are hoodies or non-uniform jumpers or tops permitted at all on site. They will be confiscated and this is a non-negotiable. These items are not allowed before school, after school, break time or lunchtime either under or over the blazer. If students are cold, then a navy-blue school V neck jumper should be purchased. Students are allowed to wear coats.

OUTDOOR COATS

Outdoor coats must be removed on entering the building and should be worn on the journey to and from school. Hoodies, cardigans and non-uniform jumpers are not permitted. These items will be confiscated. Outdoor coats should be of a dark colour where possible.

HAIR

Hair must be worn in an appropriate conventional style. Hair styles must be such that they can easily be kept neat and do not prevent students from participating effectively and safely in all school activities. Students are not allowed a grade 0 anywhere on their head. If it is an appropriate blended style it can only blend into a grade 1. If they chose to have a short style all over, then shaved heads or a grade 1 are not acceptable. There should not be any style which the school believes would undermine the ethos or discipline

of the school. To be clear this means markings cut into the hair or eyebrows, Mohicans and other extreme styles. The dying, high or low lighting of hair in natural colours is acceptable – other colours are not permitted. Students will be required to re-dye their hair in the event of failing to adhere to this rule. Hair accessories must be minimal and appropriate for the learning environment. All ling hair must be tied back for practical activities and lessons.

MAKEUP AND NAIL VARNISH

Years 7, 8 and 9 **are not** permitted to wear make-up. Make-up should be minimal and discreet for Year 10 and 11 students. Excessive makeup must not be worn. Lipstick and coloured lip balm is not permitted in any year. False eyelashes, extreme drawn on eyebrows, nail extensions, gel/acrylic nails and nail varnish **are not** permitted. Students will be asked to remove makeup if a member of staff deems it necessary.

JEWELLERY

No jewellery of any kind is to be worn, except for a watch. Watches must be removed before PE lessons. Students who wearing jewellery, other than a watch, will have these items confiscated immediately no waring will be given. Staff confiscating jewellery will place it in an envelope; the envelope will be taken to the Main Office to be locked away. Students will be able to retrieve their jewellery at the end of the day.

The school takes no responsibility for jewellery which should not have been brought into school, and is subsequently lost or stolen. However, once confiscated, the school and its staff are responsible for ensuring its security.

Please note - students should not get their ears or any parts of their face newly pierced any time other than at the start of the 6-week summer holidays, due to the length of the healing process. Covering piercings with plasters is not acceptable and students will be required to remove all piercings in line with school policy. This is non-negotiable and discussion will not take place regarding this rule.

We do not consider make-up, jewellery and non-standard items such as trainers or shirts and sweatshirts with motifs to be acceptable as school uniform. Parental/carer support is crucial in maintaining the high standard of uniform and appearance at our school. Parents/carer are asked to note that we do not accept responsibility for loss of, or damage to, personal property on, or left on, the premises.

The school retains the right to act as the final authority in the interpretation of the dress code. If unsure, parents and students are advised to contact the Heads of Year for clarification before purchasing an item.

EQUIPMENT

Students need to be properly prepared for their lessons. Students need to bring the following equipment every day: pen, pencil, ruler, eraser, pencil sharpener (these all need to be in a pencil case), planner, scientific calculator and a suitable school bag. **All students must have a reading book and their Independent Study Pack (ISP) with them.** The ISP is crucial to support learning and it also has a student's timetable in it to ensure students are always punctual.

Required Art equipment must include: Good quality A4 sketchbook (can be purchased from the art department for £1 during the first 2 weeks), selection of graded art pencils: B, 2B, 4B, 6B, black fine liner, felt tips/sharpie pens, white gel pen, tin water colour paints, fine paintbrushes and a plastic zip clear wallet to keep everything in.

Optional Art items include: Glue stick, acrylic paint set, oil pastels and paper smudge stick.

THE PROGRESS HUB (USED TO BE LINKS)

At Sir Thomas Boteler Church of England High School, we believe that every child is entitled to a broad, balanced, relevant curriculum, and fully understand that at times all students may need some additional support. As a Christian school we strongly believe that this equality of education is vital and is underpinned by **High Expectations, High Aspirations and High Standards for all**. It should not be constrained by age, gender, creed, race, physical disability, special educational need or vulnerability. High Quality First Teaching delivered by highly qualified teaching staff is available for all students. Where appropriate, students will have support form a teaching assistant in class to support their learning, and encourage them to be as independent as possible.

In addition to our subject specialist teaching staff, we have a committed Inclusion Team to offer additional support, strategically led by our SENDCO. At Sir Thomas Boteler Church of England High School, we have this year introduced 'The Progress Hub'. This is an area of school that will support our SEND students, as well as any students at the 'identification stage', where referrals to the Progress Hub can be made via the pastoral teams. The aim of the Progress Hub is to provide the 'Right Support in the Right Place, at the Right Time'. In consultation with the student, parents and carers, we can put a program of supportive intervention

in place, and seek additional support form external agencies, if required. The Progress Hub is a unique resource to Sir Thomas Boteler Church of England High School. This learning space is used, ultimately, to provide the students with the tools and strategies they may require to manage mainstream education, in the classroom with the subject specialists. The Progress Hub serves to be a happy, secure and developmental environment in which all individuals are encouraged and enabled to learn. The support offered differs from student to student, so can range from supporting their social emotional and mental health needs, speech and language and social skills. The Progress Hub will also provide support for our EAL students (English as an Additional Language).

Sir Thomas Boteler Church of England High School supports students via a holistic school approach meeting the needs of all students within the school and involves all staff. This ensures a joined-up approach to meeting the needs of every single student and the whole child. It is our belief that every child matters and we adopt a relentless approach to ensure that they are able to fully access their education.

The school website and new handbook contain a huge amount of information. We are going as paperless as possible from September for both efficiency and cost purposes. It is really important that you have all the keys apps so you can keep up to date with everything that is going on. Also, we will be communicating to you electronically regarding progress reports etc. so we need to have your correct details please. These details are also important from a safeguarding point of views as we need to be able to get hold of you.

If there is anything else that you need or that I can help with them please do not hesitate to contact me. I will always try and get back to you as quickly as I can, but I may not be as efficient due to it being the school holidays. I really appreciate your understanding with this.
