Standards

As previously shared, equipment is vital in terms of a student's preparedness for learning. One piece of this equipment is a purple pen. In class students use their purple pens to identify any fragilities in their learning. For example, if a student doesn't know the answer in one of their Recall 5 questions at the start of the lesson, the answer is eventually provided after deep thought and written into their book in purple pen. Students also use purple pens when a teacher calls a 'reteach'. This means the teacher has identified that there is some uncertainty around learning on a certain aspect. They will therefore provide a very clear model for the students to copy into their books in purple pen. When a student or teacher flicks through a work book they can identify via purple pen which areas of learning are fragile and need to be revisited.

Collective Worship - Project Hope

Hope is our first Christian Value at Sir Thomas Boteler Church of England High School. It's a simple, but powerful word. It gives people courage. It offers people direction and motivation and it changes people's lives. The term for origami paper cranes in Japanese is Orizuru. In many Asian cultures, the crane is a symbol of hope.

In Collective Worship, students have studied the inspiring story of Sadako Sasaki from Japan. Sadako was only 12 years old when she discovered she had radiation induced leukemia. It was 1955 and only 10 years since the bomb was dropped on Hiroshima. The cancer spread quickly and within a month she was hospitalized. Perhaps to bring his daughter hope, Sadako's father shared the story of 1,000 paper cranes. It is Japanese tradition that when someone folds 1,000 paper cranes their wish will come true. Sadako began folding cranes, openly wishing to survive her cancer. Around 1500 cranes later, she died a year after her diagnosis.


Sadako's passion and hope for her survival drove her to create. And her passion and story spread. Sadako became a symbol of hope and desire for peace worldwide.

In Collective Worship this half term, students and staff are taking part in Project Hope. Every student and staff member at Sir Thomas Boteler is challenged to make their own origami paper crane. Inspired by Sadako's story, our hope is that if we work together as a school community, we can make 1000 cranes and display them in our school as a reminder of our own hopes and aspirations for the future.
