Dear Parents/Carers

I hope you are all well. Please remember if there is anything I can do to help or support you then please contact us. Just a reminder that we have had some very inclement weather and we would advise students to wear a coat to school where possible.

Teaching and Learning

Independent Practice

In our lessons we have two main periods of focus. These are called 'Task Time' and 'Teacher Time'. When a teacher calls 'Teacher Time' it means they are modelling or delivering the new learning for that lesson. This is very precisely planned and delivered in such a manner as to ensure students can understand i.e. it is delivered at a slow pace with real clarity. We call this approach 'gradual release of 'granular' information. On 'Teacher Time' nobody is permitted to speak other than the teacher. This is to ensure full attention.

The second focus area is called 'Task Time'. Task Time requires students to work independently in silence. During this period students are applying their learning following the modelling phase. We expect students to be spending more time on 'task time' as they move through the school. This prepares them for their assessments and GCSEs where they will be required to sit and apply their knowledge for up to two hours in some cases.
