Year 11 Easter School Exam Preparation

The approaching Easter holiday is a crucial time for student's exam preparation where sufficient revision can make a significant difference to the overall grades a student achieves in the summer. On returning from Easter, there will only be 20 school days until the first GCSE written exams start.

It is so important that students are working independently at home each evening and that students engage with all the revision material and resources that have been provided. A reminder that for students in Year 11, the national average is between 3-4 hours of revision each evening.

In addition to the revision that students should be carrying out at home, **revision sessions** are also taking place during the Easter holidays. I have attached a timetable of the sessions that are being delivered over the Easter break. These sessions are to supplement and support the revision that students should be doing at home and not a replacement for it.

Many thanks for the role you are playing in encouraging your child to revise. I hope they revise thoroughly over the Easter holidays in order to reach their potential.

<u>Insight Into Science event – Year 10 and 11</u>

Insight Into Science event being held virtually (via Microsoft Teams) on Sat, 1st April -10am-4pm.

The day will consist of four sessions:

- A Q&A student panel, consisting of Russell Group university students studying a range of STEM degrees (some from Oxford)
- A careers panel, consisting of four careers professionals across a range of STEM careers: (1) finance; (2) pharmaceuticals; (3) manufacturing; and (4) technology. For example, we have the Head of Engineering Recruitment at Monzo joining us.
- An academic lecture, delivered by an Oxford professor (in STEM);
- A study skills session, delivered by an Oxford academic, Dr. Emily Transcianko.

TCAT Parliament took part in NW Making your Mark Survey and elected to support 'The cost of living'.


