Dear Parents/Carers

#### **Home-School Agreement**



#### The school target for each student is 96% or above

#### Reporting a child's absence

• If your child is going to absent from school it is important that you telephone our absence line on 01925 636414 and speak to your child's Head of Year. Failing to do so, will result in follow our safeguarding procedures and could result in a home visit.

#### Tracking a student's attendance

- As a school we constantly track student's attendance. If attendance falls below our school's expectations we will follow our Attendance Policy and look at intervention or support needed to improve your child's attendance
- You can track your child's attendance through the Arbor App or their ISP (independent study pack) where you will see their current attendance.



#### Year 11 Parents' Evening

Year 11 Parents' Evening is **Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2023**. The reason for holding this evening early in the school year is to enable our subject teachers to discuss your child's performance in the Mock Exams they sat at the end of Year 10 and for you to have an understanding of what they need to do in order to ensure they succeed. As you are aware, this is the most important year of your child's education so far. We will also be able to provide you with information around future key assessment dates. Our subject teachers will also explain the support and interventions that will be provided. We absolutely want the very best outcomes for your child and these conversations are crucial in securing these.

We will be using **School Cloud** as a booking system which allows you to book the appointment times that are convenient for you and is more efficient than your child having to book appointments with subject teachers on your behalf.
