



Cooking up Wild Game in Hospitality and Catering with Mr Koltan



On Monday 27th November Year 10 Hospitality and Catering students experienced a very different practical lesson! Mr Koltan led a masterclass on the preparation of wild game. He brought in two fresh pheasants and showed the students how to prepare the birds. Mrs Callaway then salted, peppered and pan fried them for everyone to taste.

The students showed a great interest in the lesson and were very surprised they actually enjoyed the taste of pheasant. A few students went back for seconds. Students were keen to 'have a go' in preparing and cooking wild game themselves, so we are planning a future session with Mr Koltan.

British Game Assurance are encouraging those who eat meat in the UK to eat wild and sustainable British meat as an alternative to mass-produced meats, stating it is the "healthiest you can eat". Wild game is not only much more sustainable but also healthier than many other meats we see today.

Game (e.g. pheasant, partridge, rabbit, venison etc.) has a lower carbon footprint than most mass-produced meats (e.g. pork, chicken, beef etc.) and is leaner, higher in protein, and lower in fat.

Thank you Mr Koltan for sharing this interesting experience with the students. We all really enjoyed the session and can't wait for the next one!


