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Dear Parents/Carers

Many thanks for all your support and patience over the parking arrangements. By working together we have found a solution. Many thanks also for your kind emails around the fact we are addressing the safety of the young people.

Please can I ask that those who are dropping off in a morning please just take care when opening your car doors. There is a clear respect for other people's property and work that is displayed around the school. Students are required to report any theft or damage to the nearest member of staff.


Environment

PE Kit 'what ifs'

- If your child is feeling unwell but in school please bring PE kit and we will adapt the lesson accordingly.
- If your child is injured or cannot take part in a PE lesson, please bring PE kit and we will ensure they still have a role within the lesson such as a referee or scorer or coach.
- If students have long hair, bobbles are compulsory and they will need to borrow if forgotten.
