Dear Parents/Carers

I hope you are well. School is a hive of academic activity at present as the Year 11 are in full swing in terms of their GCSE examinations. The students have been incredible, both in attitude and behaviour. I still have nerves for them every day, but they are very focussed and I am very proud of them.

Please can I just give you a reminder regarding **inhalers.** If your child has asthma, please can you ensure that they bring their inhalers with them to school. We are getting an increasing number of first aid calls when students are struggling to breathe and haven't brought their inhalers with them. With the warmer months coming and students spending more time outside, it is important to ensure they have their inhalers on them at all times. If there are any problems or worries regarding this then please do not hesitate to contact us.

It is really important that we have all the correct information and data on your child so if something medical or otherwise does change, then please inform us immediately as we want to ensure every child is safe at school.

Please can you also ensure that your child comes to school with a water bottle and that you encourage them fill it up at break and lunchtime. It is very important they keep hydrated and the best way is by them having their own bottle. We do have water machines and cups but the cups are not very big.

As you know I do duties every day where possible at break and lunchtime. This is primarily because I love seeing and chatting to the young people. However, it also helps me monitor the food in the canteen and the speed in which students go through the canteen. What I have noticed of late is students coming to the canteen for food 5 minutes before the bell, with the hope on occasion to maybe extend their lunch as they know I will not see them go hungry. However, I am very wise to this notion. They may be telling you the queue was too long. Therefore, I did timed research and on average, the whole queue had gone within 20 minutes. Therefore, there was plenty of time to get lunch before the bell, even on 'chip day'. Please could you have a conversation with your child on time management. I appreciate the draw of football, netball etc is way more exciting than queueing but they are responsible for their time at lunch.

Homework/Independent Study

Developing effective independent study skills is a vital toolkit to acquire for students who wish to fulfil their academic potential. With this in mind we are currently trialling a few online systems to enhance study habits and techniques, improve knowledge retrieval and deepen learning. One of these systems is known as Educake and you may notice that your child is engaging with a different programme for some of their homework. Other programmes, some of which you will be familiar with, include Seneca Learning and Doctor Frost Maths, as well as our go-to app of Satchel One. We will be investigating the efficiency and effectiveness of these systems over the remainder of this term and will inform you of any changes that may be put in place for September.

Year 11 Exam Revision Timetable

Year 11 have now completed two full weeks of exams. This week has been intense with two exams on some days with next week being similar in terms of the volume of exams.

We are very proud of the students. They have continued to be excellent in terms of their attitudes and show great resilience every day.

Students will be looking forward to the half term break, but it is important students are still preparing and revising for the exams after the holiday as there will still be over two weeks of exams left to go (three weeks for some students).

On Friday 31^{st} May, during the half-term holiday, there will be Maths and English revision sessions. Foundation Maths students will have Maths with Mr Koltan 10:00 - 11:30 and English with Mr Vallender 11:30 - 12:30. Higher Maths students will have English with Mr Vallender 10:30 - 11:30 and Maths with Miss Jones/Miss Matthews 11:30 - 13:00.

The second Maths exam is on Monday morning (3rd June), immediately when we return from half term so it is really important students take advantage of the offer from the Maths department, so they are fully prepared for that exam.

Our Exam/Revision Timetable continues with students seeing the benefit of the additional guidance and coaching from their teachers before sitting the exam paper in each subject.

Colomendy Visit - Year 7



These two students work incredibly hard, training frequently in their own time so this is a much deserved reward. It's great to see our students competing at such a high level!






