Lesson Punctuality

Year 11 Exam update

Year 11 continue to demonstrate an excellent attitude towards their exams. We have received many positive comments from our team of invigilators about how well they have approached such a long exam period.

All students have one further week of exams with some our students having exams into a further week if they study those option subjects.

On **Wednesday 12th and Thursday 13th June**, all students will have Science revision lessons Period 1 and Period 2. Students who study subjects still to be examined in Geography, GCSE DT or Hospitality are to remain in school for revision lessons during Period 3, 4 and 5 on these days. If students do not study these subjects, they are free to leave school after the Period 2 Science revision lesson.

On **Friday 14th June**, all students are to attend school as normal. Students who study Geography have their exam at 09.00. Students who do not study Geography will have a Science revision lesson during Period 1. All students will have Science revision lessons during Period 2 and Period 3 in preparation for the Science Exam which starts at 1pm.

The last main exam that **all** students sit is the **Science exam** on **Friday 14th June**. Students will be dismissed from their exam venues and are free to leave school. Only students still to sit remaining exams in GCSE DT, Hospitality, Music or Further Maths are required to come into school following Friday 14th June for revision lessons as scheduled on the Exam Revision Timetable.

KS3 WA2 Assessments

Following on from Mr Koltan's correspondence before half term, KS3 students will be sitting their second Working At assessments starting on Monday 16th June and these run for two weeks.

Students have been issued with their assessment timetables, so they know which subject assessments are taking place when.

Year 10 Mock Exams

Year 10 will be sitting their Mock Exams starting on Monday 17th June and run for two weeks. Students will be sitting these exams in our real exam venues which we have been using for Year 11.

This is to help prepare students for the conditions and environment they will need to work in during the Year 11 Mock Exams and the real GCSEs at the end of next year. These exams will assess all of the work covered since September and will be based on past exam papers and questions.

Morning Exams: start at 09:00. Students must arrive at school at 08.30 and go to form as usual. They will then be sent to the canteen at 08.45, where they will be escorted by invigilators to their exam venue.

Afternoon Exams: start at 13:00. Students must wait in the canteen at the end of lunch, where they will be escorted to the exam venue.

Please note it will be an early lunch for the mock exams (12.15–13.00, and 12.25-13.00 on Fridays).

Students **MUST** bring all the necessary equipment required (including a scientific calculator) for each subject. **Full uniform is to be worn for the exams.**



We're very proud of their hard work and dedication to the Award!








