## **KS4 Year 10 Working At (WA) Assessments**

Students will be sitting their first Working At (WA) assessment of this year in all of their subjects during assessment fortnight (Monday 20 January – Friday 31 January 2025). This may take the form of a test or an assessed piece of writing/practical piece of work.

Students will be provided with revision lists giving details of the topics and content that will be tested. We are also encouraging students to take their workbooks home to revise. It is important that students look after their workbooks and check they have the correct books that are needed for the following day when packing their bags for school each evening. The expectation is that students spend time each evening preparing for the assessments. Constant revision and practice is the surest way to fully embed skills and knowledge required to secure excellent achievement at KS4.

All tests will be classroom based and undertaken under exam conditions. It is important that students are used to working in this environment so they are fully prepared for their examinations in Year 11. Students are expected to be fully prepared for all assessments with the correct equipment which includes:

- Pen
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Eraser
- Pencil sharpener
- Pencil case
- Scientific calculator

## **Safe parking at the end of the school day**

Thank you to those who have engaged with the previous message regarding safe parking at the end of the day, however, please can we remind you of this key message to keep all of our students safe.

We appreciate that there is limited parking at the end of the school day when picking up your child, however, on far too many occasions cars are parking in the yellow bus stop markings. This is putting our students at risk, with buses then having to stop outside of the zone, often then stopping on the Pelican Crossing. Further to this, we are then seeing one lane of Knutsford Road blocked, and cars speeding to get out and around the busses, often cutting in front of other cars. We know this will not apply to many, however, we want to increase the awareness of this concern as we all have a duty to ensure that our students are safe when they leave school.

We know that it can be hard to ask for support at times, however, we really encourage those who are in need of support at this time, particularly in this lead up to Christmas. Twins Beth and Charlotte Glover collected their excellent results in summer after two years studying at Priestley College.

With four A\*s Charlotte secured her place at the University of Oxford studying Earth Sciences and, after collecting three A\*s of her own, Beth was offered a place at Sheffield studying Biological Sciences.


"I was worried that if one of us didn't get into university it might affect the other's day, but it has all turned out ok," said Charlotte.

Both twins are former pupils at Saints Peter and Paul Catholic High School in Widnes and both fully immersed themselves into life at Priestley College, taking The Graduate programme which helps prepare students for the most competitive universities.

## Courses to careers in the environment

Priestley has a range of around 70 courses and many are connected to the environment. Here are just three of them and more can be found listed in connection with our Sustainability Honours Programme.


### Environmental Science

Learn about global warming, extinction, alternative energies and resources as well as how to understand environmentalist / anti-environmentalist propaganda and hard scientific evidence. You will be exposed to current scientific development and opportunities.




### Geology

Develop a range of essential skills for Higher Education and the world of work. Through exciting topics, you will understand the nature of physical and human geography whilst unpicking the debates surrounding the contemporary challenges facing the world today.



### Applied Science

This course offers an exciting look at science through applications rather than theory. You will conduct in-depth practical work and your own research. Learning methods include completing assignments, case studies and projects based on workplace situations.





# SUSTAINABILITY HONOURS PROGRAMME

PRIESTLEY IS PROUD TO BE DEVELOPING **THE GREEN LEADERS** OF THE FUTURE

As Priestley works towards becoming a sustainable college, we have introduced the Sustainability Honours Programme to equip students with the skills they need to thrive in this growing and vital industry.

The programme has been developed with our employer and education partners to equip students with the knowledge, skills, values and attitudes that empower them to contribute to sustainable development within their lives, society and future careers.

Students who embark on this programme will become sustainability change-makers who can reflect on the social, cultural, economic and environmental impact of their decisions, behaviours and actions.

With a deeper understanding of local and global sustainability challenges and priorities, they are better placed to initiate and promote sustainable development within communities and the workplace.

Learning focuses on UNESCO's Sustainable Development Goals and, with the support of specialist teachers, students independently examine the application and relevance of these goals to their lives and the subjects they study, with opportunities to extend knowledge, application and expertise through competitions, enrichment options, work experience, Higher Education initiatives, and various research, community, and employer projects.

Students will graduate from college with either Bronze, Silver, or Gold Honours, depending on the number of sustainability awards they achieve.

# Pre Med

**Our Pre-Med Course is an established enrichment that supports students applying for Medicine, Dentistry and degrees linked to the healthcare profession.**

Students are prepared for Medical school applications, interviews and UKCAT/BMAT.

The course also supports students wishing to enter medical research and degree courses at leading universities.

Pre-Med will also offer the following:

- Provide support and opportunities for students to arrange work experience at local hospitals, care homes, charity shops and hospices.
- Work with Russell Group universities such as Manchester and Liverpool University to deliver hands-on workshops and specialist lectures including Speech Therapy, Audiology and Pharmacy.
- Medical workshops include First Aid, Suturing, bandaging and human physiology.
- Lectures by leading academics, doctors and consultants in the medical field ranging from Orthopaedic/neuro/plastic surgeons to Psychology Lectures delivered by Oxford University.
- Medical Summer Schools at leading universities and healthcare weekends hosted nationally, which can be heavily discounted or free for some of our students.
- Work with Oxford University on projects throughout the year with a minimum of three interactions and at the end of the first year, mock interviews are also held with Oxford Researchers.
- Mentoring by former Priestley students currently studying Medicine, Dentistry and various other healthcare degrees.
- In groups, research, debate and discuss current medical issues and understand the importance of the NHS and medical ethics.
- Students will also develop and further understand the important characteristics required for successful healthcare workers such as integrity, teamwork, cultural competence etc.
- Initiate and lead the annual STEM Christmas fundraising campaign.





# NHS Cadets

**This is a one-year course that takes up to two hours per week.**

**The key skills module is an introduction to essential skills that you will use both as an NHS Cadet, and in future healthcare roles. You will be given an overview of the pathway and St John's values, as well as get to know the other Cadets in your group. There are also sessions to develop your awareness of practical skills like moving and handling, GDPR, safeguarding and first aid which will be useful in future healthcare roles.**

Topics include:

- Key clinical skills
- Healthcare and the bigger picture
- Well-being and empathy
- Understanding care
- Leadership and career skills

This course is for anyone interested in healthcare / a career in the NHS. Priestley are the first college in the North West to deliver this course developed by St John's Ambulance. The course includes some practical work, but the main focus is on skills set development for healthcare.

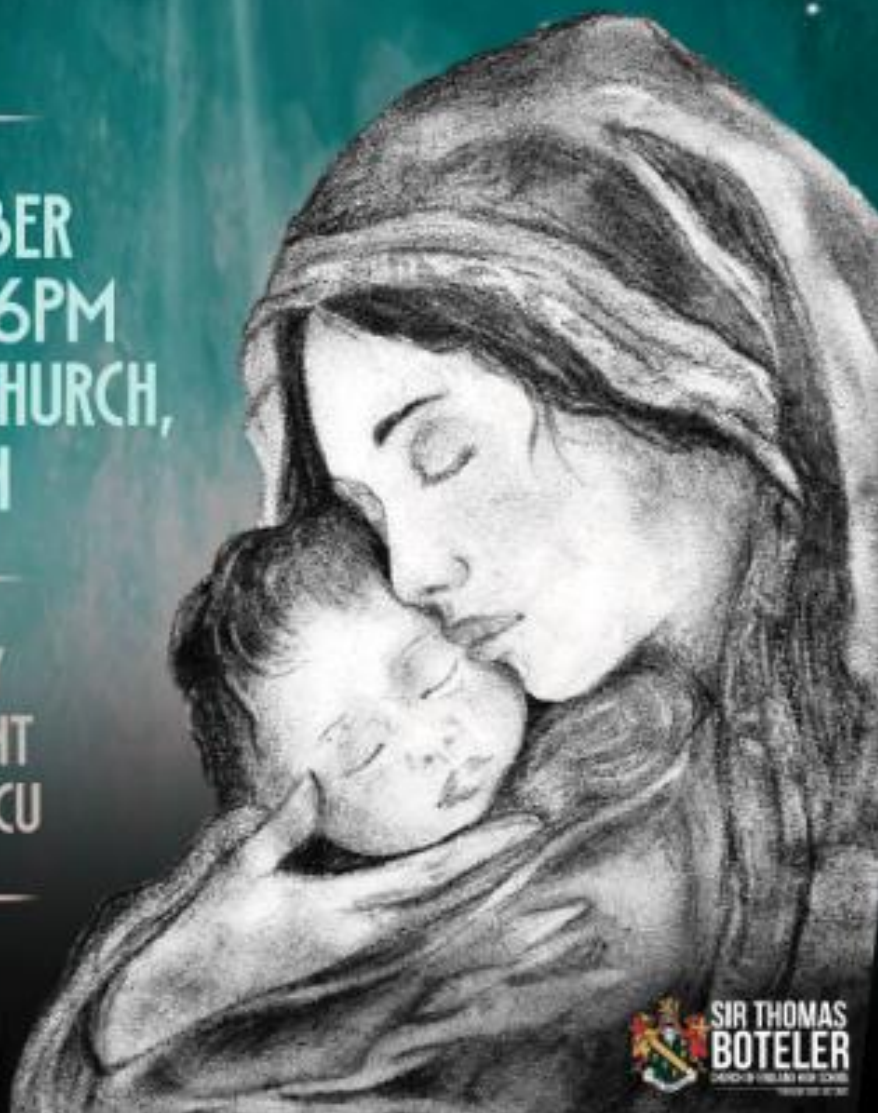

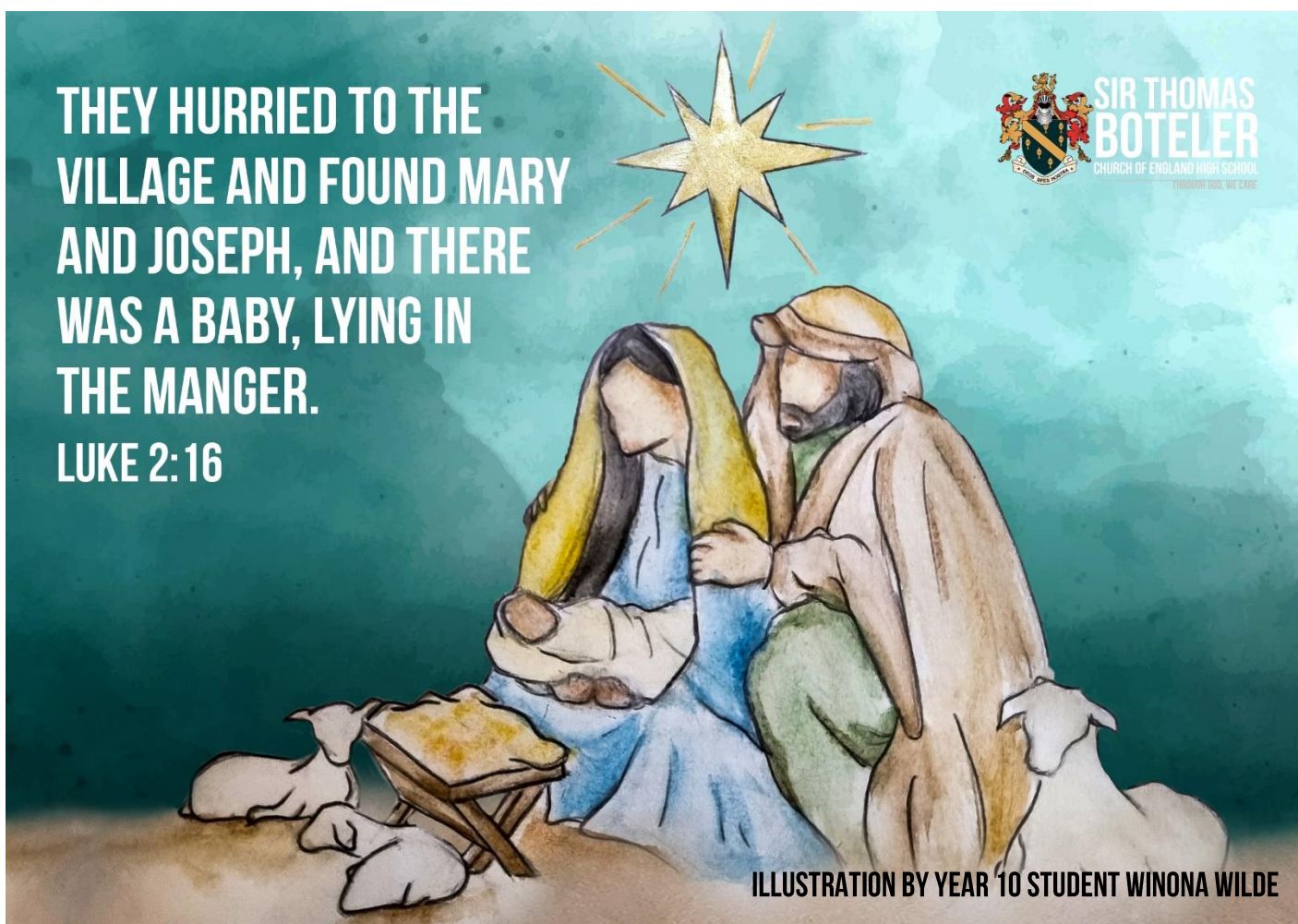
We look forward to another successful term ahead and thank you for your ongoing support.

## STEM at Priestley College

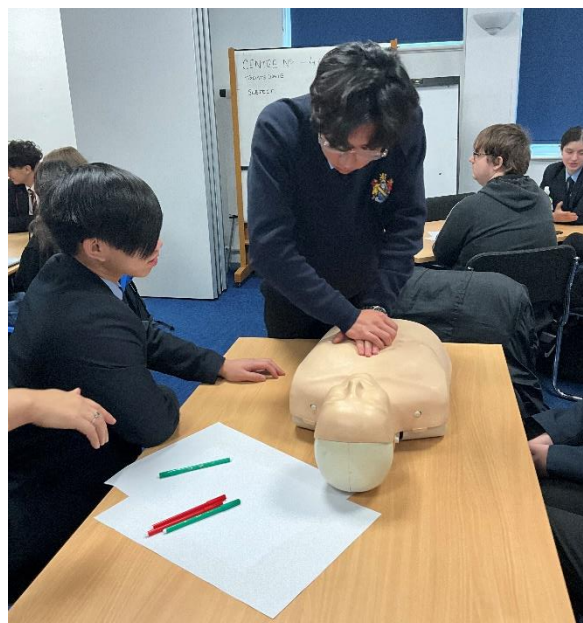
Our Science Department are currently looking forward to working closely with the Science Department at Priestley College this year. With the aim of providing STEM workshops on a variety of subjects our students, along with the current Year 12 and 13 at the college. This will have benefits for both cohorts of students, and give ours a taste of college life. Look out for further announcements as the academic year progresses.

To kick start this year's range of workshops 30 our Year 10 students were thrilled to attend 2 workshops, one on the medical profession and how to progress in this field and then a week later they worked with the Mersey Trust in a career's session in the ever-increasing job market in environmental conservation and science. In both workshops our students worked with students from the college.

Year 10 students excelled in the 'careers in medicine' seminar. Our students worked with Priestley students to debate current medical issues such as privatising the NHS and assisted suicide. One of our teams won a prize for their arguments in the debate too! Students also heard from a current NHS doctor, a previous Priestley student, to learn how to perform emergency medical treatment.

In the Environmental workshop students were treated to a fascinating presentation in the many ways into working in the environmental sector, from the hugely important area of volunteering, and then how to progress with the various courses on offer today. This was followed with the pathway of one of their officers from school, through university with volunteering and securing a highly sought-after post. Then our students mixed with the college students to discuss the problems faced by today's rivers, and they presented each group plans on how to minimise the polluting effects. It was amazing to see how well both sets of students worked well with each other.

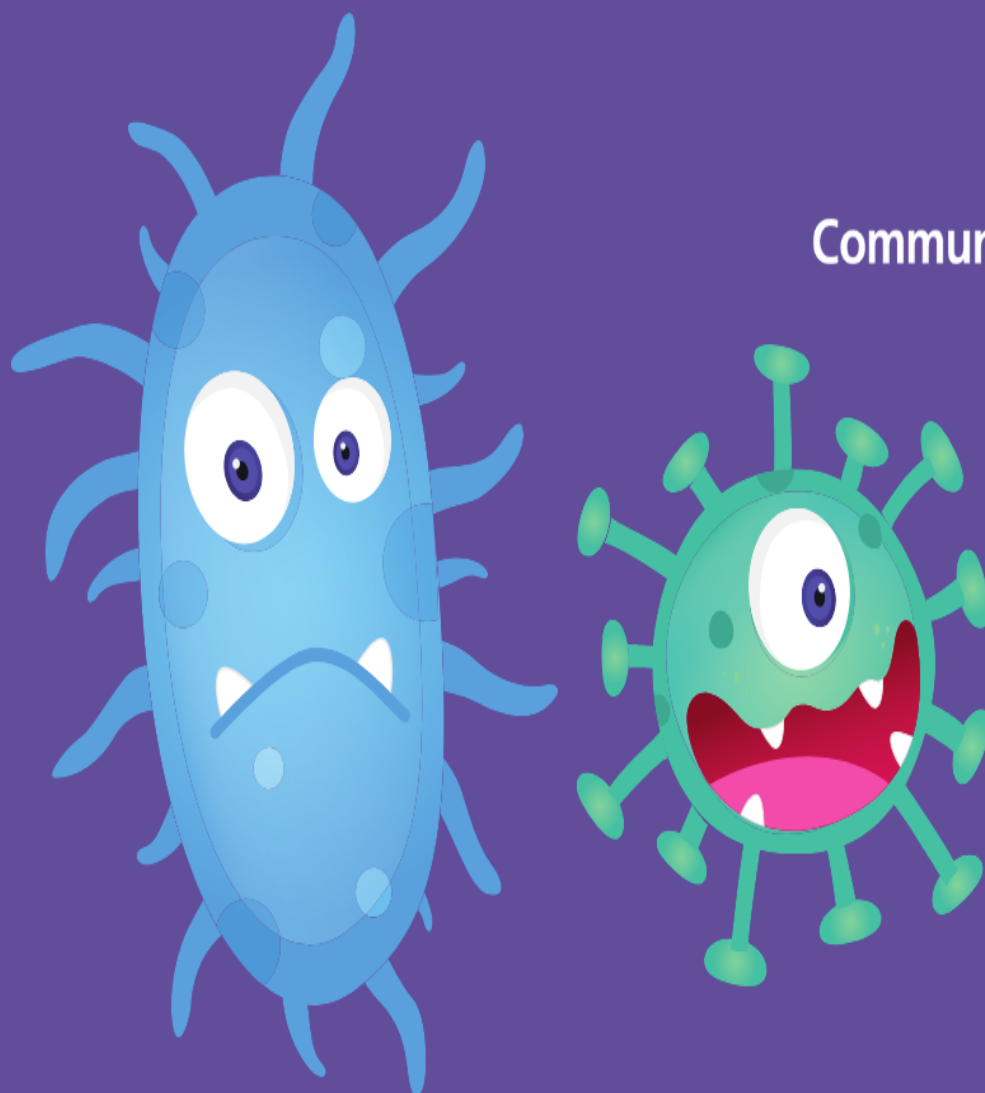

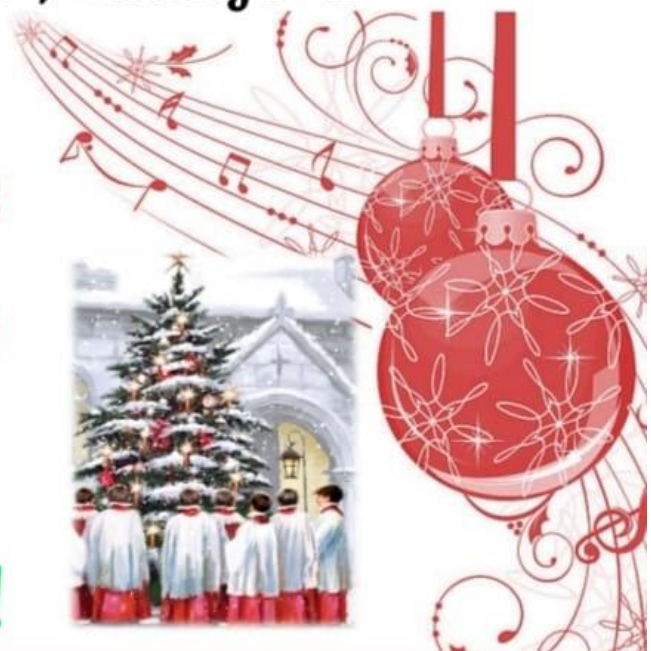
