Dear Parents/Carers

I hope you are well. At least the weather is better than last week. There have still been a couple of minor heating issues in school so we have let students be inside with coats on, until this has rectified. We will let them know in Form Time if this rule changes. Again, many thanks for all your support in relaying messages to the students.

Just a reminder that it is an INSET Day on Wednesday 22nd January 2025 as per the published calendar dates. By law we have to have 5 INSET days a year. I do my best to ensure that they do not always fall on the same day as that would mean the students would always miss learning with as the same classes would be affected. I just thought I would share the rationale as I appreciate that a random Wednesday may look strange on paper.

The students have been completing their 'Working at 1' (WA1) assessments and we have all been really impressed with how seriously they have been taking them. It has been really lovely having academic conversations with the students about their performance and how they really care about how well they are doing.

We have had lots of activities happening, some of which are referenced in here and also, they are celebrated on our social media pages. It is wonderful to see so many of our young people getting involved in the wider curriculum and having real success too.

Please can I remind you to collect any jewellery that has been confiscated. It is all locked in the safe but I am just conscious that it needs to be picked up please.

I appreciate that this next point does not affect the vast majority of you, but it is important that I am just very clear around our expectations in communication. Arbor is how we communicate and therefore parents/carers do need to have the app and check it regularly. I just also want to be clear that we will not tolerate any (verbal or written) communication that is rude, aggressive or disrespectful. My front-line office team are incredibly supportive and helpful and whilst I appreciate you may have a worry, concern or frustration, inappropriate communication is just not acceptable. We will always help you in any way we can, but please, just be polite.

Say it again, say it better

In lessons it goes without saying that we closely monitor the written responses to the questions and tasks that we ask our students. This is closely monitored and relevant, meaningful feedback is provided. However, increasingly, the challenge posed to students on how they verbally respond is also a priority. We have a responsibility as a school to support our students in developing their articulation skills, be that to articulate their learning or articulate their feelings and opinions.

In lessons teachers ask questions which are targeted towards certain students. We adopt a mixture of 'hands up' and 'hands down' responses i.e. the latter being the teacher chooses which student answers. Once a student has responded, if there is any room for improvement whatsoever to their answer i.e. greater detail, a higher tier word, improved pronunciation etc the teacher will challenge them to 'say it again and say it better'. This prompts a quick reflection for the student to consider 'how can I improve this response?' If the student is unable to then the question is posed to another member of the class i.e. 'How can X say it again and say it better'.

This process helps develop a number of skills and characteristics including resilience and confidence in speaking in public. It also challenges students to 'uptier' their language using subject specific terminology. Sometimes this leads to strong academic discussion where students debate and share opinions. This forms key experiences for life both outside of and beyond school.

One of our emerging whole school priorities is 'Oracy'. In future editions of the Head's Herald I will share more information on how this is developing.

Year 9 Options Evening is on Thursday 23rd January at 18:00. This is a compulsory event as the Options process will determine what subjects your child will study at Key Stage 4 and will influence future career pathways and/or further training.

Heads of Department, our careers advisory service Careers Connect and further education establishments will be available to answer any questions and offer guidance about subject choices and explain details about specific courses. Students attending the evening need to be in full school uniform.

Attendance at Sir Thomas Boteler Church of England High School

You will be aware of our continued drive to ensure all students have high levels of attendance and the communication regarding this is regular.

The half term in the lead up towards Christmas can be testing, with schools often seeing a rise in the number of students absent for illness and unauthorised absence. We will continue to be here to support our students and families and we ask for daily communication when concerns arise.

Our Attendance Booklet (<u>https://t.ly/5nfKw</u>) is a recent addition to the website and provides key information regarding:

- Legal requirements
- Key staff who can support you and your child

We have had some parents/carers question their child's attendance headline figure and we have again had to stress the importance of good punctuality and the Government introduction of the U code – arriving late 30 minutes after the register has closed.

'Please note that a U code is classified for statistical purposes as unauthorised absence, where this may lead to more formal attendance procedures being put in place'.

Students have been reminded about the Christmas rewards and recognition plans and we ask students to reflect on their own performance:

•Do you have a positive aggregate of conduct points? (House Points minus Behaviour Points?

•Do you have 96% + for half-term 2? (Fresh start for all students.




Hospitality & Catering


